## Traffic Reminders

The SEES traffic plan was created to ensure student safety while moving traffic efficiently on Schoolhouse Way for both schools. It is important for everyone who is picking up/dropping off your child at school be informed of the traffic plan. Here are some reminders while driving on campus:

- Drive-up lane is a **CELL PHONE FREE ZONE**.
- Handicap spots are designated for those cars that have a displayed handicap placard.
- Students may only be dropped off at the curb. Parents who enter the parking lot must park and walk their child to the school sidewalk. This is for your child's safety in the parking lot.
- Jaywalking is occurring on a daily basis on Schoolhouse Way. Crosswalks are located near the entrance of the school or at the signal. When adults jaywalk, students think that it is safe to follow.
- Red curbs have been painted as a no parking zone.
- Drive up closes at 3:25p (2:25p on Wednesdays) to ensure that our teachers are off duty on time.
