### Red Ribbon Week

Red Ribbon Week is a nationwide anti-drug campaign that usually takes place in the last week of October. Its focus is on the prevention of drug use through education, with special emphasis on encouraging children to pledge their commitment to living drug free. Students dress up each day as a fun reminder that they will lead drug free lives.



Here is the pledge that all students will say on Friday at Flag Salute:

"I pledge allegiance to myself and who I want to be. I can make my dreams come true, if I believe in me. I promise to keep my dreams alive and be all that I can be. I know I can, and that's because I pledge to stay drug-free."

There will be a Red Ribbon contest this year. For each day a student dresses up, they earn 1 point for their classroom. So, if they dress up all 5 days, they earn 5 points for their class. At the end of the week, the class with the highest percentage of students dressing up wins a free recess!

**Monday-** Team Up Against Drugs (Sports Jersey or Sports Wear)

**Tuesday-** Shade Out Drugs (Wear Sunglasses)

**Wednesday-** Sock It To Drugs (Wear Crazy or Mismatched Socks)

**Thursday-** Don't Get Tied Up In Drugs (Wear a tie, Tie your hair up, Wear Tie-Dye, or do all 3!)

**Friday-** Red Rally Day (Wear Red)




